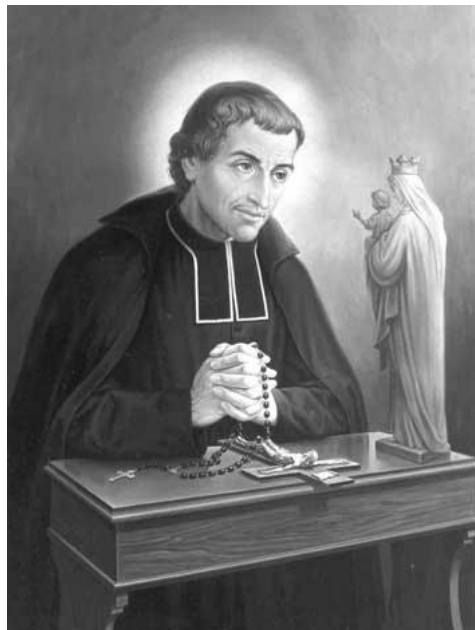

St. Louis Mary de Montfort, Priest

Born in the Brittany village of Montfort, Brittany, France in 1673, Louis later as an adult identified himself by the place of his baptism instead of his family name, Grignon. After being educated by the Jesuits and the Sulpicians, he was ordained as a diocesan priest in 1700. Soon he began preaching parish missions throughout western France. A poor man himself, Louis identified with the poor underclass he served. The poor, in turn, loved him immensely. He, with his preaching and hymn - singing, lifted their hearts as he taught them how to pray the rosary and reform their lives.

When newly ordained he was assigned to a hospital in Poitiers France, which he reorganized. At the same time, he formed a religious community that became The Daughters of the Divine Wisdom and who cared especially for the sick. His opponents began to resent him and his success. He was forced to resign. The Bishop banned him from Poitiers causing him to walk to Rome to get the approval of Pope Clement XI. Upon receiving the Pope's approval and new title of "Missionary Apostolic," Louis returned to his native Brittany where he evangelized the poor the rest of his life.

Upon his ordination to priesthood, Louis devoted himself to the Blessed Virgin and thereafter always taught his hearers how to pray the Rosary, and promoted its amazing graces and benefits. Today, people still use his book *True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary*, a renowned classic about Marian devotion. Louis died suddenly in 1716 at 43 years of age. May he pray for us and intercede for us!
