Special Year of St. Francis— Pilgrimage Indulgence

Pope Leo XIV declared until January 2027 a **Special Year of St. Francis** to mark the 800th anniversary of the beloved saint's death. The faithful can obtain a plenary indulgence by visiting a Franciscan church, or praying for this indulgence if unable to travel. The usual conditions apply: going to Confession, receiving the Eucharist, and praying for the Pope's intentions. In the Springfield Diocese one can make a pilgrimage to St. Francis of Assisi Church in Teutopolis, St. Francis of Assisi Church in Springfield, or St. Francis Adoration Chapel in Alton.

In Other Matters ...

We ask for greater fire safety. Please be aware of where the fire extinguishers are located, and always use the provided safety lighters for shrine candles, never conventional sulfur matches (some of which have been found on the St. Elizabeth church carpet).

Only authorized staff can move candles or adjust the shrine display in any way. (We had a very close call with a fire recently. This hazard must stop. Our lovely 1907 Robinson church is old, and would be a tinder box in a fire.)

If this fire safety policy is not followed, surveillance cameras will be placed near the shrine, or we will remove the shrine real-candles altogether. None of us want that, but safety is paramount, especially for our children in The Cry Room.

A handful of folks are leaving weekend Mass in Robinson immediately after Communion, before the closing announcements, blessing, and recessional hymn. Unless there is a pressing need, why would anyone rush out of Holy Mass before its proper conclusion? The moments after reception of the Eucharist are among the most powerful and sacred.

Friends, please “take ownership” of our two churches as goes their care, cleanliness, and maintenance above-and-beyond what our cleaning and grounds-keeping staff can do; these fine workers cannot be everywhere all the time.

Please, for example, assist us in keeping the restrooms clean and well-equipped with paper products and soap. Please alert us to any messes or plumbing issues, such as with running toilets, or with lights needlessly left on.

(We are also staying mindful of dog-waste on church grounds, especially on the northside of St. Elizabeth between the curb and sidewalk.)

We are a family. We need each other to care best for our parish campuses. May we especially always remember our churches are Houses of God!

The Cry Room is for young families with small “active” children who may require a separate spot apart from the main assembly. This Cry Room space—both the two pews and the separate chairs—is reserved exclusively for these young families—that is, left available for them, even after Mass has begun. (Young families, with all they juggle, sometimes understandably run a little late.)

Recently we saw a young family with two little ones denied comfortable space in the Cry Room because single able-bodied adults chose to sit back there in the room's two pews. If this continues such may encourage young families—The future of our churches!—to worship elsewhere. We always seek to be welcoming to all, and to especially be family-friendly.

Again, the Cry Room is primarily for young families with active children! Please respect this policy.

Celebrating the Holy Trinity: In Brief, From The Catechism of The Catholic Church

742 "Because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!'" (Gal 4:6).

743 From the beginning to the end of time, whenever God sends his Son, he always sends his Spirit: their mission is conjoined and inseparable.

744 In the fullness of time the Holy Spirit completes in Mary all the preparations for Christ's coming among the People of God. By the action of the Holy Spirit in her, the Father gives the world Emmanuel "God-with-us" (Mt 1:23).

745 The Son of God was consecrated as Christ (Messiah) by the anointing of the Holy Spirit at his Incarnation (cf Ps 2:6-7).

746 By his Death and his Resurrection, Jesus is constituted in glory as Lord and Christ (cf Acts 2:36). From his fullness, he poured out the Holy Spirit on the apostles and the Church.

747 The Holy Spirit, whom Christ the head pours out on his members, builds, animates, and sanctifies the Church. She is the sacrament of the Holy Trinity's communion with men.
