

Robinson Clothing Center is happy knowing they can put out several new pairs of all-sizes socks for their clients throughout the cold months, and continually restock from our donations.



Patron Saint: St. Elizabeth of Hungary

Elizabeth was born the daughter of the King of Hungary. At the age of four she was betrothed to Louis, an heir to the Central European Duchy of Thuringia (a German principality).

Elizabeth was moved to Thuringia to grow up with Louis. At the age of 14, in that ancient cultural era, they married, having grown in love. She chose a life of penance and severe discipline, when she could have enjoyed a life of luxury and leisure.

Elizabeth bore Louis three children, a son and two daughters. Under the spiritual direction of a Franciscan friar, she led a life of prayer, sacrifice, and service to the poor and the sick. Seeking to become one with the poor, she wore simple clothing and often took bread to them in the surrounding area. (Many poor would daily appear, and be fed, at the palace gate.)

Louis may have become a saint by his gracious patience with his wife since a lesser man could not have endured her severe self-discipline and penance. Louis died of the plague on his way to a crusade after only six years of marriage. Heartbroken, Elizabeth continued in her ascetic service-minded ways.

Louis's family claimed she was squandering the royal purse and mistreated her, even throwing her out of the palace. It wasn't until the return of her husband's allies that she was reinstated in the palace since her son was heir to the throne.

Elizabeth died at age 24 in 1231 after founding a hospital in the name of St. Francis of Assisi and always caring for the poor. She lived with such great love for the poor and the suffering that she is the honored patron of Catholic charities and of the Secular Franciscan Order.
