Sacrament of Marriage


If you are considering marriage, please contact the Parish Office no later than 6 months prior to the proposed wedding date, and the diocesan and parish guidelines will be explained.



From Father David

Sisters and brothers, I need some extra prayers please for some dear friends I've known for years. This young couple live in Wisconsin near Milwaukee, are the parents of four little ones, and are in a tough situation. The fourth child—a precious little girl named Perpetua—was just born after a very difficult pregnancy. Her road ahead looks quite challenging, but this strongly-Catholic family is very prayerful, close-knit, and united in faith. I am doing my humble part to recruit additional prayers for them. Will you help us? Will you please pray for little Perpetua, her mother Lizzy, her dad Michael, and her three older siblings?

Mike was a seminarian classmate of mine, kind and brilliant and in love with the faith. He discerned out of religious formation in an honorable way, and then met—and fell in love with—Lizzy, a very kind Catholic young lady. The rest, as they say, is history. They were married in a stunningly beautiful traditional Catholic ceremony, and remain staunchly Catholic.

Here is part of Mike's recent text message to me: (Quote). "Lizzie is doing well, delivery went far better than expected, two minor miracles of her going into labor three hours before her induction and our transverse baby suddenly being rightly oriented in the last moment, circumventing a C-Section.

Perpetua has been in the NICU since birth. There were a dozen staff members, and a dozen cables plugged into her keeping everything working. She's stable now and in good hands. Current prognosis, is high probability of Down syndrome, multiple gaps in the digestive line, including in the esophagus, which means multiple surgeries, upwards of a 6-12 months hospital stay (looking like 6 months) and lifelong upkeep. Breast milk is through a tube for that duration. There's a minor abnormality in her brain, and several in the heart, but none are severe enough to concern the docs. Everything else looks okay. She was baptized today in anticipation of surgery, whereafter more information will follow.

God's hand is evident throughout. His will be done. All will be well, thanks in large part to prayers and sacrifice. Thank you, again; means more than I can express feeling the strength of Mother Church bearing our littlest one to

God's mercy." (Unquote).
