

All you need to do: Purchase the item on the tag of your choosing and **return the unwrapped item and tag** to the basket labeled *Advent Project* at the front entrance of the church on any weekday, or at weekend Mass, between now and **December 14th**. (You may also turn-in your gifts at the parish hall office during weekday hours.) **Please**, it is very important participants bring back the **unwrapped item as well as the original color-coded tag** attached to the item.

If you are buying clothing, remember the recipient may have limitations with buttons (unless your tag specifies something about buttons) or he/she may in general have trouble dressing themselves. Also, Please do **not** buy extra holiday food items unless the tag specifies food. Cash donations as well as personal checks made out to *St. Elizabeth Church* will be accepted. These funds will buy gift-wrapping supplies.

Will you consider sharing your blessings with someone who needs your help this advent season? Will you help them feel loved and remembered?
