


## Our Lady of Lourdes (February 11, 2026)

On February 11, 1858 a 13-year-old peasant girl (Bernadette Soubirous) was collecting wood when she heard wind and other sounds coming from a small cave in the hillside near Lourdes, France. Looking closer, she saw the most beautiful lady surrounded by a golden light—Our Blessed Mother, The Lady of Lourdes!

Mother Mary later revealed herself to Bernadette as “The Immaculate Conception” and instructed her to dig in the ground. A spring emerged with miraculous healing powers!

We are “thinking outside the box” as goes the new office configuration. The new hire can put her or his “individual stamp” on the office, and can be either full-time with full benefits, or a part-timer, depending on their respective needs.

We will be generous with monetary compensation, and with some flexibility in work-hours and duties. Current office hours are 8-4 Tuesday through Thursday, and 8-Noon on Monday and Friday, with a paid lunch hour, and paid holidays.

Patti Buercklin is prepared to stay as co-office manager as needed. She currently helps wonderfully with multiple tasks, including the ministry schedule, Mass intentions, and the bulletin.
