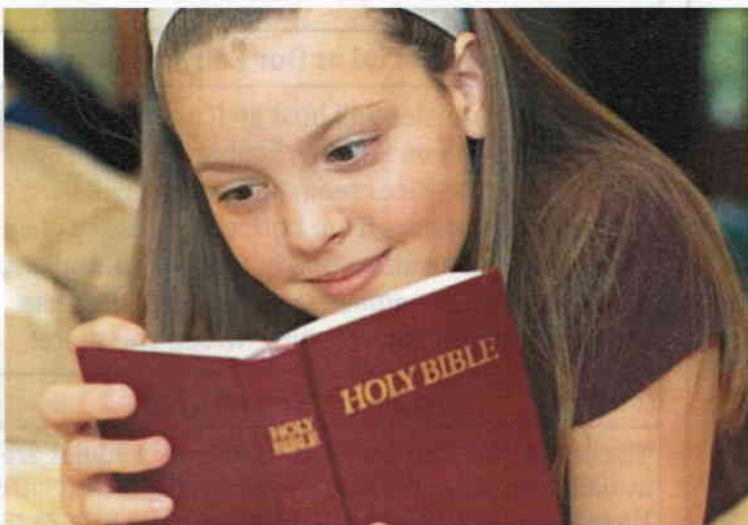

A Wife and Mom Shares about the Blessings of FORMED

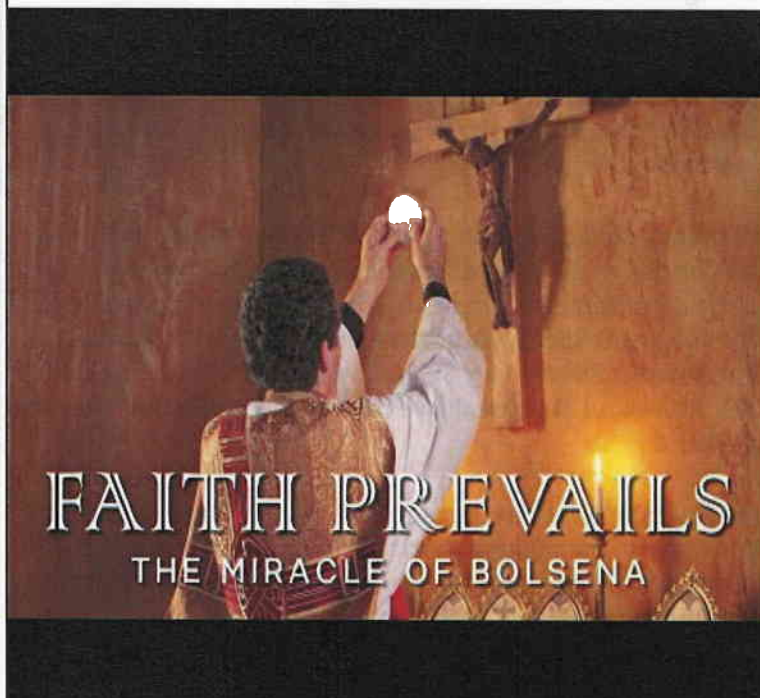
Have you checked out FORMED.org yet? With Robinson's zip code (62454) to sign-in and your email, you are clicks away from a wealth of solid Catholic family-friendly information, education, and wholesome entertainment! (What's more, it is free! The subscription cost is covered by the parishes.)

Our Gospel readings, for example, from the last few weeks tie-in perfectly with FORMED videos that strengthen our faith about Jesus in the Eucharist. These are brief videos, yet powerful! (There are longer movies too, but if you want something quick—say, while you make supper—FORMED has you covered!)

One of my favorites is "Faith Prevails: The Miracle of Bolsena," a thirty-seven-minute video that tells the true story of a Eucharistic miracle, an answer to a doubting priest's prayer. As we watch the priest pursue answers, and get answers he isn't expecting, we fall in love with the Eucharist even more!

This is a brief, simple, yet engaging, video. Put it on while you or your family do dishes, make supper, or work-up the last of the summer garden produce—"The Miracle of Bolsena," like FORMED itself, is a real treat!

Tootsie Roll Campaign

The Knights of Columbus "Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities," better known as The KC Tootsie Roll Drive, will be held the weekend of September 14 -15 throughout the State.

The Newton Council 1704 will be participating, and some Robinson-based members will take donations after Masses that weekend, and at the RHS football game on Saturday, September 14th.

All money collected (minus cost of Tootsie Rolls) is kept by the Council to distribute to various charitable organizations in the area. Some recipients in the past have included Special Olympics and Special Education Programs at St. Thomas, and Newton Elementary School. When the Robinson Council was active and at its peak, we raised close to \$5,000 over the weekend.

The Tootsie Roll Drive began in 1970 in Chicago and has become one of the biggest charity projects for the Knights of Columbus. Over those 54 years, the KC has raised hundreds of millions of dollars for this charity.
