A Letter from the Archbishop for the Military Services, — Second Collection November 9 —

Dear Brethren,

Allow me to express my profound gratitude to your parish community for participating in the upcoming National Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS).

This collection is approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to be taken every three years, to increase the awareness and support of the mission, "Serving Those Who Serve." The ministries offered by the AMS benefit those who serve in all six branches of the U.S. Armed Forces, Veterans, and their families.

The mission of this Archdiocese is to ensure that service members, veterans, and their families be able to seek sacramental preparation for baptism, confirmation, First Communion, penance, and marriage; to benefit from consultation with a priest, and to receive the sacrament of penance as they defend our rights of freedom and speech, and face constant transition and uncertainty.

In addition, the AMS Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program is the only vocations program in the United States that provides priests to serve as military chaplains and also to serve in parishes and dioceses across the country that struggle with their own critical shortage of ministers. When the priest separates from the military, he then returns to his diocese or community.

Please help me continue to provide for those entrusted to my pastoral care—including those who may originate from your own parish or diocese. Please pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Know that your intentions will be remembered at the altar.


All-Souls Day Candle Mass, 2025

Saint Bishop Charles Borromeo, Memorial, Nov. 4th



In 1560, Pope Pius IV appointed his 22-year-old nephew—Charles Borromeo—to be a cardinal-deacon, administrator of the See of Milan, and later the secretary of state, and cardinal protector, of Portugal, the Friars Minor, and others fraternal orders. The Pope's choice may seem to be nepotism, but Charles was a very accomplished, holy, and gifted young man.

Charles's skillful diplomacy withheld forces that threatened to end the bishops' work of the final gathering of The Council of Trent, which brought about the most important disciplinary and doctrinal decrees of the Counter-Reformation.

The untimely death of his elder brother brought Charles to the decision to be ordained a priest, despite relatives' insistence he marry and continue The Medici Family's Milan business interests.

Soon after he was ordained a priest at the age of 25, he was consecrated Archbishop of Milan, where the church and its people were in great disarray. He brought about great reform, and worked tirelessly for the salvation of souls.

As a bishop, he personally visited all the parishes in his vast domain and was known to be *hard as flint* to get the troubled Church there turned around. While firm, he dealt with offenders with prayerful patience and kindness.

Charles took the initiative in giving good example. He allotted most of his income to charity, denied himself luxury, and imposed severe penances on himself. He sacrificed wealth, high honors, and influence to become poor.

During the plague and famine of 1576, he tried to feed sixty-to seventy-thousand people daily. To do this, he borrowed large sums of money requiring years to repay. While civil authorities fled at the height of the plague, Charles stayed in Milan, where he ministered to the sick and the dying. Work and the heavy burdens of his high office took a grave toll on his health. He died at forty-six in 1584. St. Charles is the patron saint of pastors; of Catholic reformers, and of care-providers.
