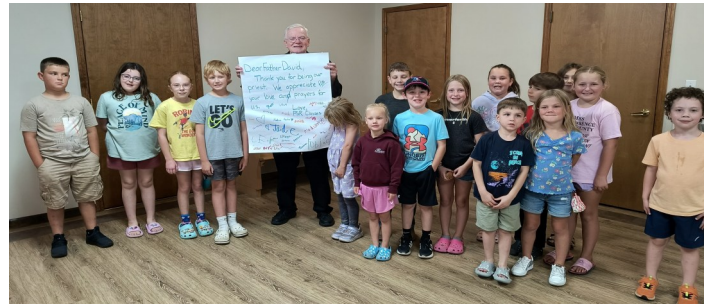

- **Any color:** black, white, and dark gray are common, but any color accepted
- **Any brand:** that you (or your children or grandchildren) wear daily will be perfect

**Step # 2 - Bring the unopened package (for size sorting) and place it in the box at the back of the church from Oct. 4-26.**

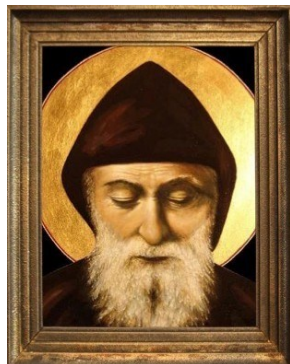

### **St. Charbel First Class Relic (and Other Relics) Coming to Vandalia and Springfield,**

A First-Class Relic of St. Charbel Makhlouf, the miraculous Maronite priest, monk, and hermit from Lebanon, is coming to our diocese for the first time from his homeland. Catholics across Illinois are invited to this rare spiritual encounter. The relic will be available for public veneration at two locations: the sanctuary of the Sorrowful Mother in Vandalia (318 N. 8th, Vandalia, IL 62471) on October 7–8 (Mass at 5p.m., veneration from 4–8 p.m. both days) and the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Springfield on Sunday, October 19, following the 10 a.m. Mass. **Additional relics of holy men and women—including St. Padre Pio, St. Carlo Acutis, the three Fatima children, and a piece of the True Cross—will also be present.** Come bring your intentions and experience the powerful intercession of the saints.
