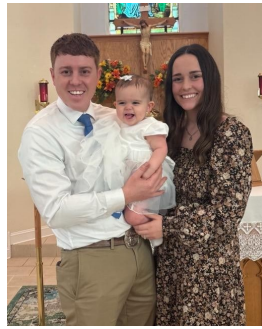

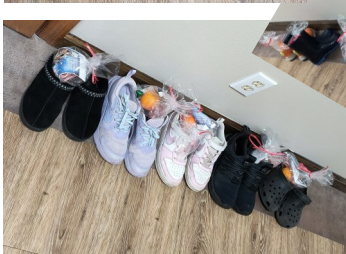
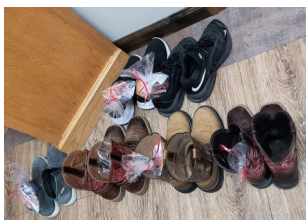


Dual Parish Christmas Dinner
