Safe Environment Audits

This program is for **any and all volunteers** within the parishes, and is super-easy. Anyone who assists at Mass, PSR, janitorial, serves as dinner volunteers, etc., must please watch this simple logged-in video at home, and complete a simple one-page form. By doing this training now, it will be easier in the future to update, or for the process to be done for you automatically. Isn't this a small price to pay to promote a safer environment for our parishes and our kids?

Online Schedule Supersedes Bulletin

Dear Friends, we cannot emphasize enough that Mass scheduling—especially *weekday* Mass scheduling—in the bulletin is not written in stone. Emergencies and pressing priorities do arise, including Last Rites, special anointings, crisis management, and short-notice bedside visits. We make no apologies for these *occasionally* needed changes to weekday Mass schedulings listed in the bulletin, **and in fact allude to this policy on the front page of every bulletin**. We ask our daily “regulars” to especially be mindful of *Thursday scheduling* as regards the noon liturgy. IDOC and RCC often give very short notice of openings and lockdowns, which impact where I can be ministerially. If there have been IDOC staff shortages or lockdowns, and then the ability suddenly arises for a Thursday prison Mass for the inmates, I feel called to go. These incarcerated men are hungry for the faith given their difficult circumstances. **Please avail yourselves of the parish Facebook page for up-to-date real-time changes to weekday Mass scheduling when possible.** Thank you. The Assumption of The Blessed Virgin Mary August 15, 2024, A Holy Day of Obligation

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII solemnly declared a centuries-held common belief of The Catholic Church: The Immaculate Mother of God, the Ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, **was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory.**

Scripture does not give a specific account of Mary's assumption into heaven. Nevertheless, since Mary is closely associated with all the mysteries of Jesus's life, it is not at all surprising the Holy Spirit led the Church to believe in Mary's share in His glorification. So wonderfully close was she to Jesus here on earth, she must be with Him body-and-soul in heaven! It is easy to understand how the Father would not want the body (the sacred vessel) of the earthly mother of His Son to undergo corruption.

In the light of The Assumption of Mary, it is helpful to pray her Magnificat (Luke 1:46-55) with new boldness. In her glory, Mary proclaims the greatness of the Lord and finds joy in God, her Savior! God has, indeed, done marvelous things for her. She longs to share this marvel with others by bringing them ever closer to her Son.
